Since the upcoming renewal of the Marpole-Oakridge Community Centre was announced by the Vancouver Parks Board commissioners last year, things are moving forward! On June 19, 2017 the MOCA (Marpole-Oakridge Community Association) Board of Directors signed a 15-year Joint Operating Agreement with the Park Board effective January 2018. An RFP (Request for Proposal) is now underway and the Park Board will soon select a consultant to conduct a public consultation about the new community centre - please make sure you and your friends and neighbours participate in the consultation! We and the consultants need to know what MOCC programs you like, as well as a lot more information about how you use the centre - the more you share during this process, the more you can help to build a community centre that meet our needs. Data collected from the consultations will enable us to develop programs you enjoy and to build a building that will support the future of MOCC!

Once the consultation results are compiled, the initial building design phase will allow us to learn the cost of the project, make adjustments and prioritize features and amenities.

Please remember this is going to be our community centre, it will serve us first and foremost. We need and want your participation and your input - don't sit on the sidelines and watch, get involved in the future of MOCC!
